Population: 297,100

WELL-BEING

- The unemployment rate in Clayton is 7 % while the Georgia average is 3.9%.
- 25% of children in Clayton are living in poverty, while the Georgia average is 20%.
- 52% of children in Clayton live in single parent families while the Georgia average is 34%

SEXUAL & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

- The teen pregnancy rate in Clayton is 10.8 per 1,000, compared to the Georgia average of 9.9 per 1,000.
- The teen birth rate in Clayton is 21.1 per 1,000, compared to the Georgia average of 16.5 per 1,000.
- 17% of teen mothers in Clayton are giving birth to a second child while the Georgia average is 14%.
- The STD incidence of youth in Clayton is 35.9 per 1,000, compared to the Georgia average of 28.3 per 1,000.

MENTAL HEALTH

- 7% of youth in Clayton expressed that they've seriously considered attempting suicide while the Georgia average is 6%.
- 78% of youth in Clayton expressed that they've felt stressed.

PHYSICAL HEALTH & NUTRITION

- 7% of youth in Clayton consumed alcohol in the last 30 days while the Georgia average is 8%.
- The obesity rate in Clayton is 43% while the Georgia average is 34%.
- 37% of the youth in Clayton were not physically active for at least 60 minutes in the last 7 days.
