WELL-BEING

- The unemployment rate in Columbia is 3 % while the Georgia average is 3.9%.
- 9% of children in Columbia are living in poverty, while the Georgia average is 20%.
- 19% of children in Columbia live in single parent families while the Georgia average is 34%

SEXUAL & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

- The teen pregnancy rate in Columbia is 4.3 per 1,000 compared to the Georgia average of 9.9 per 1,000.
- The teen birth rate in Columbia is 6.4 per 1,000, compared to the Georgia average of 16.5 per 1,000.
- 14% of teen mothers in Georgia are giving birth to a second child.
- The STD incidence of youth in Columbia is 13.3 per 1,000, compared to the Georgia average of 28.3 per 1,000.

MENTAL HEALTH

- 7% of youth in Columbia expressed that they've seriously considered attempting suicide, while the Georgia average is 6%.
- 91% of youth in Columbia expressed that they've felt stressed.

PHYSICAL HEALTH & NUTRITION

- 10% of youth in Columbia consumed alcohol in the last 30 days while the Georgia average is 8%.
- The obesity rate in Columbia is 39% while the Georgia average is 34%.
- 18% of the youth in Columbia were not physically active for at least 60 minutes in the last 7 days.
